

# Resource Screening and Identification Consultant (Contract)



## Background

The Alliance for Innovation on Maternal Health (AIM) is a national, cross-sector commitment designed to lead in the development and implementation of patient safety bundles for the promotion of safe care for every U.S. birth. The AIM National Team at the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists (ACOG) provides expert technical support and capacity building to multidisciplinary state-based teams, most often perinatal quality collaboratives, leading target rapid-cycle quality improvement (QI) via implementation of patient safety bundles. With 42 enrolled states and over 1,800 participating facilities, AIM seeks to engage all US states and territories in its maternal health quality improvement network.

AIM seeks a Resource Screening and Identification Consultant to provide subject matter expertise to ACOG for review of existing resources and selection of new resources to support AIM Patient Safety Bundle (PSB) implementation, including clinician education and data collection supports. The Consultant will work collaboratively with AIM staff to review and identify associated resources for core AIM PSBs; configure and present all identified resources to the AIM website for national state team use; and presentation of resources to AIM participants.

## Statement of Work

The Consultant will perform the following services (including all related deliverables), and such other work as the consultant and ACOG may agree during the Term, with project deadlines to be set by ACOG.

- Expert literature reviews for the identification of educational and implementation resources for core AIM patient safety bundles;
- Attendance at all scheduled calls with members of expert working groups and/or working group leads to provide expert guidance, input and facilitation;
- Attendance at scheduled check in calls with ACOG staff to discuss progress towards project goals and milestones; and
- Expert review and presentation of resources to AIM participants with AIM subject matter experts at the time of publication of revised core AIM patient safety bundles via webinar.

## Qualifications

- Consultants will be evaluated and selected based on their background and expertise in healthcare provider education, patient safety and quality improvement, and maternal child health. Successful consultants will have at least 7 years of experience in the field of maternal child health and an advanced degrees in a health care and educational field and/or doctoral degree in a related field are preferred.

Presentation of Resources	Plan and develop a series of webinar and/or podcast presentations, that will be recorded, to discuss educational and implementation resources identified for the revised core AIM PSBs	Within 30 days of the publication of revised AIM PSBs
